Justification

I. The Significance of Justification

Rom. 3:26 With a view to the demonstrating of His ... that He might be righteous and the One who justifies him who is of the faith of Jesus.

II. Objective Justification

Rom. 3:20 ...shall be justified before Him;

A. By the Grace of God

Rom. 3:24 Being justified freely by His [God's] grace...

B. Through the Redemption of Christ Jesus

Rom. 3:24 Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus

Rom. 5:9 Much more then, having now been justified in His blood,

C. Through Our Faith in Christ

Gal. 2:16 And knowing that a man is not justified out of works of law, but through faith in Jesus Christ...

D. Proven by the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ

Rom. 4:25 Who was delivered for our offenses and was raised for our justification.

John 16:10 And concerning righteousness, because I am going to the Father

III. Subjective Justification

Rom. 5:18... so also it was through one righteous act unto justification of life to all men.

A. By the Life of God

Phil. 1:11 Being filled with the fruit of righteousness, which is through Jesus Christ

B. Through the Resurrected Christ

Rom. 4:25 Who was delivered for our offenses and was raised for our justification.

Col. 1:27 ... Christ in you, the hope of glory,

Col. 3:4 When Christ our life is manifested, then you also will be manifested with Him in glory.

C. In the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ

1 Cor. 6:11 ...but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God.
